1 Translate into Arabic:

It is hard to believe that there was a time when the internet did not exist. It is now impossible to imagine life without it. In fact, it only started to be in general use about 30 years ago. Before that, computers were mainly used for writing documents or performing calculations. The internet is a source of knowledge, making dictionaries, encyclopaedias and instruction booklets instantly available to everyone. It stores our photographs, documents and diaries, and it reminds us of our appointments. It is also a platform for communication, and in recent years we have increasingly relied on it to see and talk online to friends, relatives, colleagues and clients. Employees have discovered that they can work remotely, changing the concept of the traditional workplace, and patients do not always need to go to a medical centre to consult a doctor. However, greater reliance on the internet, particularly in the area of education, has highlighted social and economic inequalities. Parts of the world do not have easy access to it; some people cannot afford the necessary equipment; and others, especially the elderly, do not feel comfortable about using the technology.
