- (b) Explain what this incident shows about the role of Peter in the Acts of the Apostles. [6]
- (c) 'It does not matter who replaced Judas as an apostle.'  
To what extent do you agree? Show in your answer that you have considered more than one point of view. [8]

- 2 (a) Give an account of the incident involving Ananias and Sapphira. [6]
- (b) Explain what this incident might teach Christians today. [6]
- (c) 'Stories about tensions in the early church should not have been included in the Acts of the Apostles.'

- 3 (a) Describe what happened after Peter had escaped from prison in Jerusalem and the angel had left him. [6]
- (b) Explain the role of Herod in the Acts of the Apostles. [6]
